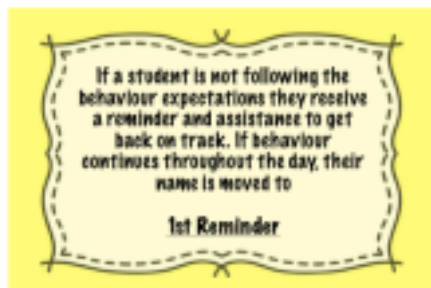


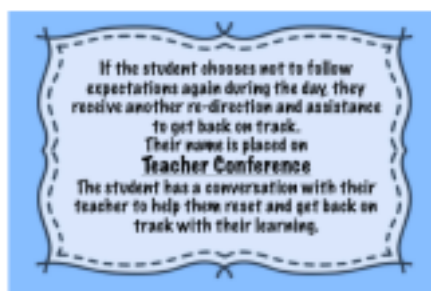
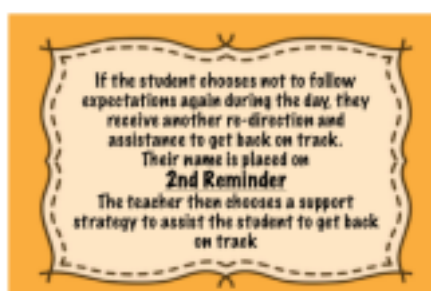


Classroom Correction Sequence Information for Parents/ Carers

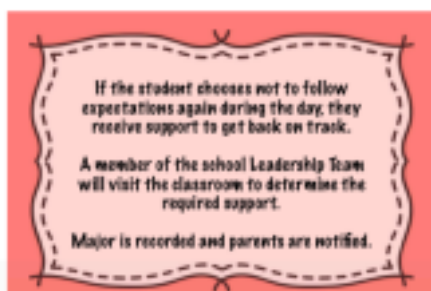
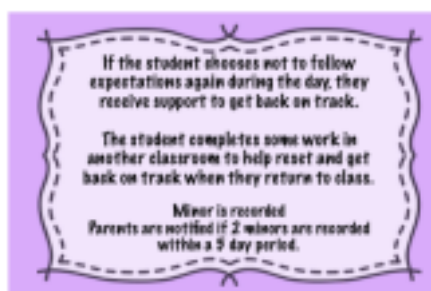


What is the classroom correction sequence?

The classroom correction sequence is a method used across the school to maintain a consistent approach to behaviour management within the classrooms. The correction sequence clearly outlines what occurs when students are redirected by the teacher during class time. The emphasis is on returning children to focus on their learning when they may be distracted or causing distraction within the classroom. The sequence displayed in classrooms is similar to the accompanying image.



The Correction Sequence is a *visual reminder* for the children to return to their work displaying the expected classroom behaviours for the task at hand. Your child may begin to talk about the sequence as he/she begins to understand the system a little more. Once understood, the learning of all children, including your own, will be enhanced. We are continuing to enhance the use of this tool to support our students to remain active learners.



The Correction Sequence works hand in hand with reinforcements and rewards. Children are able to receive acknowledgements and earn rewards even if a correction has been given. Children may break a rule or not keep to the expectation, but if they later do the right thing, then this

can be acknowledged by a teacher. At the beginning of each day all students are moved back to the top of the sequence for a fresh start.
