Sirach 3:17-20,28-29 Heb 12:18-19,22-24 Luke 14:1, 7-14 Isaiah 66:18-21

When this was written, Jerusalem stood as a shell of its former glory. The people struggled to rebuild God's Temple and the city. Morale was very low. These passages shook the people from their despair. God's glory would one day return.

Hebrews 12:5-7, 11-13

God has various ways of correcting our conduct, sometimes by his Spirit. He wants to bring the people back to acknowledge and confess their sins. He brings the people back to a sense of their true duty to God and others.

Luke 13:22-30

Jesus is speaking to people who were used to the idea of being "chosen", but who had lost sight of the challenge that goes with being chosen. Some of those who thought they were chosen may be excluded and those that were thought to be "outsiders" would be part of the Kingdom of God. The Kingdom of God is inclusive not exclusive.


