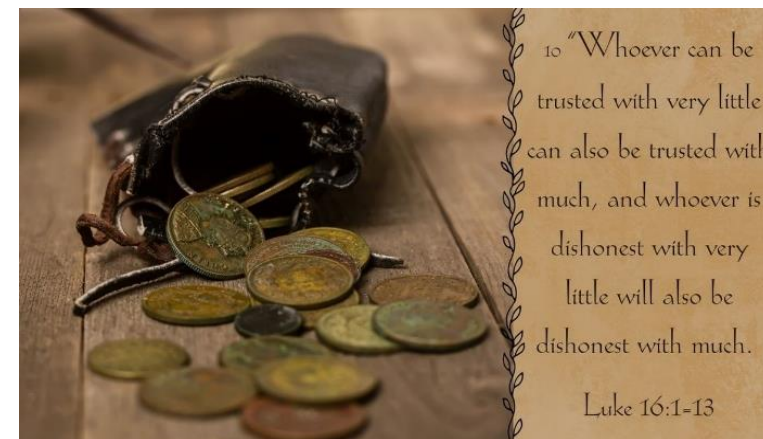
## Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist
